### **Language Learners In-Bound Exchange from Germany**

Friendship Force International recently approached FFCNC with a request to host a Language Learners Exchange from Germany in September 2009 and the Board approved. Ten to fifteen ambassadors are expected to sign up for the exchange, which is being promoted at an all Germany Friendship Force conference. These ambassadors will spend their first week in NC, then travel on to Florida for a second week of the exchange. Dates are yet to be determined, but their visit to NC will probably be around September 21-25. A typical Language Learners Exchange entails an English as a Second Language (ESL) class, usually for half a day, and the remainder of the day is available for normal hosting and programming activities. Ralph Cauthen has agreed to serve as our Exchange Director. He is currently forming an Exchange Committee and wants to involve as many members as possible as we plan to welcome our German Language Learners. ### **FFCNC's Financial Health**

In this time of fiscal uncertainty, please be assured that our club is in excellent financial condition! We maintain three accounts. Our operating funds are in two accounts—checking (\$3,500) and short term CD (\$4,800)—at Sun Trust in Kernersville. Treasurer Arnold Sporleder uses the checking account for day-to-day expenses and receipts. The combined total of \$8,300 represents the remainder of funds brought to the merger in January 2006 by GCCIU (Guilford

County Citizens for International Understanding) and the Friendship Force of Winston-Salem. \$8,300 is 75% of what the combined funds totaled at merger. We have used about 25% of these funds over three years.

Our third account is an endowment with the Winston-Salem Community Foundation, a legacy from the Friendship Force of Winston-Salem. Its value at the end of January, 2009 was \$11,992. Because the value is tied in part to financial markets, it declined in 2008. The board has not utilized any funds from this account since the merger, keeping it entirely in reserve.

### **Harrisburg Inbound Exchange: May 11—15**
