Cost of Japan Exchange Reduced

Peter Peiffer, ED of this year's joint outbound exchange with Harrisburg to Aichi (Nagoya) Japan, advises that the trip—including a week's homestay and a second week of travel in Japan—is now estimated to cost \$3,700 instead of \$4,400 per person. Airfare reductions are responsible for the decline. If the group increases to 15 people, the price will drop further!

November 8—21, 2009 are dates for the trip. It is a reciprocal exchange: ambassadors from Aichi visited both the FFCNC and Harrisburg chapters in fall 2007. Our Aichi friends are very anxious to show us as good a time as they had in the Triad.
