Focus on Friendship ~ January 2011

Ottawa in September

The Friendship Force of Central North Carolina will have the privilege of being hosted by the Friendship Force of Ottawa (FFO) September 22 – 29, 2011. FFO, winner of a best club award at the 2010 International FFI Convention last fall, has 185 members and typically hosts four inbound exchanges and sends four out-bound exchanges each year. This is clearly a well experienced club and ambassadors of FFCNC are sure to enjoy a successful exchange.

Approximately 1.2 million people live and work in Ottawa, the capital of Canada. Located on the border of Ontario and Quebec. Ottawa is a city full of European culture. Next week the FFO planning group will begin the planning for our visit, so a specific itinerary will be forthcoming. However, we know that a typical in-bound exchange to Ottawa includes a visit to the Houses of Parliament (pictured here); the National Gallery of Canada, one of Canada's premier art galleries with a focus on Canadian Byward Market, Canada's continuously operating farmer's market; the Thousand Islands, an archipelago of islands that straddle the US-Canadian border in the St. Lawrence River; and the Mackenzie King



Estate, home of William Lyon Mackenzie King, Canada's longest serving prime minister. All of this and more surrounded by the beautiful fall colors of Canada!

This out-bound exchange will be a joint venture with the Friendship Force of Florence, SC (FFF.) Our Florence partners, led by Exchange Director, Duane Rupert, have planned a pre-exchange trip to NYC (two nights), Saratoga, NY (one night), and Montreal (two nights.) The Florence group will fly from Charlotte to NYC on September 17th and from there will make the remainder of the journey by train on Amtrak and VIA (the Canadian rail line.) Hotel costs for this pre-exchange excursion are estimated to be \$375 per person (double occupancy.) Meals and other activities such as plays will be additional expenses. If you are interested in participating on all or a portion of this pre-exchange trip, please contact Ralph Cauthen and he will serve as liaison with Duane Rupert to facilitate your travel plans.



Due to the relative close proximity of Ottawa (approximately 800 miles from the Triad - a lot closer than New Zealand!), the cost of this exchange for land only is estimated at \$375. Initial indications are that some FFCNC members will want to drive and have the flexibility to visit other friends and family along the way, while other members may choose to fly. Currently four FFCNC couples (the Cauthens, Meises, Peiffers, and Andresens) are signed up for this exchange. FFO has a total capacity to host

ambassadors. The FFF has twelve ambassadors ready to go. This leaves just <u>five spaces</u> for additional FFCNC ambassadors. Prior to joining FFCNC Judy traveled in the USA, Mexico, Western Europe, Scandinavia, North Africa and Australia. She heard about Friendship Force from a Danish friend who is a member of a FF club in Florida and joined FFCNC in the spring of 2008. Since then Judy has served as

a home host for exchanges from Turkey, Azerbaijan, and the President's Roundtable. Judy has traveled with FF on two international exchanges (organized by other clubs), spending three weeks each in Costa Rica (Feb. 2009) and Turkey (Sept/Oct. 2010), and looks forward to participating in a future exchange with FFCNC.
