Meet Linda & Marvin Scherl



We know your curiosity is peaked after reading about the Scherls recent lengthy sojourn to Nepal, the culmination of befriending several dozen Nepalese students at Salem College over a number of years. You won't be surprised to learn that their adventuring spirits brought them together—and here's their story:

Marvin was born and raised in New York City, graduating with an engineering degree from Georgia Tech in 1959. Linda was born and raised in Brazil, where her parents were missionaries.

She has a Nursing degree from Duke University (1965), and a Master's in Public Health Nursing Supervision from Teacher's College at Columbia University (1970).

The Scherls met at a ski lodge in Vermont in 1968 and were married in 1970. In September 1971 they set out from NYC on a sailboat with another couple to sail around the world...and got as far as Miami, Florida, before the social dynamic of two couples on a small boat failed. Marvin and Linda sold their share of the boat to the other couple and bought a Winnebago motor home. For the next 42 months they toured the United States, Mexico, Canada, and Alaska, putting 95,000 miles on the motor home in one long trip.

In 1975 they ran out of money and places to go. Having been all over the USA, they decided that the Triad area would be the most comfortable place to settle. After a little bit of experimentation in vocation, Marvin took up a career in data processing and Linda re-entered nursing. In 1979 Linda became the first executive director (and only employee) of Hospice of Winston-Salem/Forsyth County, the first Hospice in North Carolina."

The Scherls first learned of the Friendship Force in 1991 when Marvin joined an exchange to Thailand. Since then one or the other of them has been on exchanges to Australia, Japan, New Zealand, Mexico, and England. Linda has also traveled privately to Australia and Japan for five weeks each, staying primarily (no hotels) with friends made through the Friendship Force.

Linda and Marvin have participated in many incoming exchanges over the 20 years they have been involved with the Friendship Force. In 1999 Marvin began maintaining the membership records of our chapter—before it became FFCNC. He currently serves as Vice President/ Membership Chair.

Brazil Outbound: Travel Plans Proposed

Our co-EDs, Peter Peiffer and Judy Greene, have proposed an exciting 12 night itinerary for the exchange which will begin September 18th. First stop will be two nights in Rio de Janeiro followed by the six night homestay in Cascavel, a mid-size city in the agricultural state of Parana. On to the nearby and spectacular Iguassu Falls for two nights...and finally another two nights in Buenos Aires, Argentina, before returning home on the 30th.

Flights to and from South America—into Rio and out of B.A., a round trip with "open jaw"—must be arranged by each ambassador. There is also a Brazilian visa (\$140) which each ambassador must obtain. The six nights lodging plus flights from Rio de Janeiro to Cascavel and from Iguassu to Buenos Aires will be included in the exchange cost—which is estimated under \$3,000.
