Their week will start with a day in Greensboro with a new twist to our traditional visits to the Civil Rights Museum and the Guilford Courthouse National Military Park. This will be FFCNC's inaugural Car Rally/Scavenger Hunt. Our visitors will spend Tuesday in Winston-Salem (Old Salem and Reynolda House) and have an opportunity to try North Carolina brewed beer at Foothills Brewing.
