#### Pike's Peak Friendship Force of Colorado

Many thanks and much praise go to Laura Lennon, exchange director for our inbound exchange from Colorado, for organizing this domestic exchange. Domestic exchanges differ in some respects from international inbound exchanges. On rare occasions, as with this one, our guests arrive in their personal cars at different times making a traditional welcome with guests, hosts, and club members impractical. Laura saw this and other challenges as opportunities and developed a successful schedule for the week. Because of the varied arrival plans and the fact that there were no language barriers, participants in this exchange did not meet as a group until their visit at the SciQuarium the morning after their arrival. That allowed guests more flexibility the day/evening of arrival to rest from their drives and become acquainted with their hosts.

Another challenge of the week was presented with the federal government shut-down. A visit to the Guilford Battleground was on the schedule! But it was scheduled on our lucky day – the first day the park reopened. Better still for our group – due to the shut-down, the park was not busy that day as school groups had cancelled their visits when the shut-down began.

There were several history buffs among our group of Colorado guests and they were very pleased to visit both Old Salem and the Battleground, both of which they knew little about. The highlight of the week was a visit to Graham, N. C. to see "The Art of the Brick" Lego art exhibit at the lovely Capt. White House (1873) which is the home of the Alamance Arts Council in Graham. The exhibit is currently showing in six countries around the world, but with very limited showings in the US. So those who made the trip to Graham were lucky to see this amazing exhibit.

Our farewell event was limited to guests and hosts due to space limitations. The group had dinner at Liberty Oak restaurant and then attended "The Top of the Mountain" at Triad Stage. The play is about the last night of Martin Luther King's life and tied in well with Monday's earlier visit to the Civil Rights Museum.

Shortly upon their return home our Colorado guests were already extending an invitation for FFCNC to visit them. Laura will follow up on possible dates for such an out-bound FFCNC domestic exchange. 2015 seems the likely timeframe, though there is a possibility it could be scheduled in 2014.

One might question why Friendship Force, an organization whose mission statement is "To promote global understanding across the barriers that separate people," would be involved in domestic exchanges. There are several reasons for this. For new members considering their first exchange, a domestic exchange may be less intimidating than an international exchange. For older members who may have health or physical limitations, domestic travel may be easier. For working members with busy schedules and tight budgets, domestic travel is usually less expensive and the exchanges are usually of a shorter duration. But most importantly for all FF members, domestic exchanges provide the opportunity to increase one's knowledge of our own country and cultural differences within the United States. And one last benefit – it's nice to have friends in places you would like to visit. Seems like the Lennons may be planning a ski trip to Breckenridge, Colorado in the near future. Hmmmm. I wonder who they will be visiting there????

#### 2014 Out-bound Exchange is Expanding

#### <u>Moldova</u>

We are pleased to announce that Barton Parks has agreed to be the exchange director for our 2014 outbound exchange to Moldova. As we mentioned in the last newsletter, this exchange will differ from typical out-bound exchanges. FFCNC has agreed to mentor a group in Chisinau, Moldova as they form a new Friendship Force club, the first in Moldova. This will be their first ever exchange hosting ambassadors (FFCNC!) from another country.

Many of you may remember Mariana Tourcan, the facilitator who accompanied the Open World delegation last fall. She has been instrumental in organizing the first steps of this new Moldovan club and she will act as their exchange director for this first exchange.

Our visit there will not be "all work and no play," but there will be an element of work as FFCNC ambassadors share their expertise with the new Moldovan FF members. Our role as ambassadors will be to mentor our counterparts regarding such issues as how to recruit members, organize meetings, conduct an exchange, publish newsletters, etc. One of Barton's

duties will be to select a group of ambassadors who possess a range of these skills and experience so that we can provide guidance to the new club.

At this time it is our understanding that the Moldovan members can host fifteen ambassadors. The exchange will take place in September 2014 and last approximately one week. We should learn more details, such as exact dates, later in November. Due to the limited capacity of the Moldovans to host and the mentoring nature of this exchange, it may be necessary to interview potential ambassadors and select the final group of ambassadors. This will in part be dependent on the amount of interest expressed by FFCNC members.

#### **Turkey**

There is a lot of excitement over the opportunity to assist our friends in Moldova with the creation of a new club. At the same time, your board felt it important to be able to offer an outbound exchange on which all members, even newly recruited members, could participate. With that goal in mind, FFCNC asked FFI in Atlanta if it would be possible to offer a second week of home hosting with another FF club.

We have just learned that FF Ankara, Turkey has offered to host FFCNC following (most likely) the visit to Moldova. This club has been dormant for the last few years and is anxious to resume home hosting. You may remember that in October 2008 FFCNC hosted the FF club from Cankaya, Turkey. Cankaya is a suburb of Ankara, so this exchange may present the opportunity to reconnect with some of our former guests.

A second exchange director will be selected to arrange the exchange to Ankara. The initial thinking is that there will be some travel between the two home hostings and also that members will have the flexibility to participate in one exchange **or** the other **or** both. #### 2014 In-bound Exchanges

#### **Open World from Kosovo**

Once again we have been asked to develop an Open World program for a group of delegates, this time from Kosovo. Ray Kiszely and Ralph Cauthen, having both worked with previous Open World programs, jumped at the chance to serve as co-exchange directors. We have been told that this delegation will arrive in the Triad on January 10, 2014 and depart on January 18. As is always the case with Open World programs, this duo will be charged with the task of developing a forty hour program on one of several relevant themes suggested by Open World. FFCNC is proposing a program about "Women Leaders." It is too early to know the size of the

delegation and its composition, but if our suggested theme is accepted the delegation will likely be all women.

It will be a challenge to plan and organize both the program and home hosting during the busy holiday season, but this gives Ray and Ralph no hesitation.
