

What is Friendship Force all about?

People. People befriending people. Friendship Force is a private non-profit organization active around the globe. (www.friendshipforce.org) Its purpose is to bring people closer together through international journeys of citizen “ambassadors”...sowing the seeds of friendship across the barriers, both cultural and geographical, that divide us all.

Is Friendship Force a travel club?

That’s how it starts....but Friendship Force places emphasis on *faces* as well as places. Ambassadors may cover great distances and see many places during a journey...but the success of the journey is always measured in hugs, handshakes, and new friendships.

Can anyone be an Ambassador?

Those who find the differences between people intriguing and can adapt to an environment and lifestyle different from their own will enjoy Friendship Force journeys. Flexibility, a spirit of adventure, and a sense of humor are the qualities you’ll need if you travel as an Ambassador or open your home as a Host.

Are there other ways to participate?

Not everyone has the space, time or inclination to be a Host or Ambassador. There are many opportunities to support journeys and interact as friends with people living in our community who are from other cultures. Good friends are made while the cause of world peace is served.

What, exactly, is a Journey?

A one-week intercultural learning and sharing experience. Citizen Ambassadors travel together to and from an assigned host country. Met by Friendship Force Hosts who have been eagerly anticipating their arrival, Ambassadors spend the week in their Hosts’ homes. Ambassadors find they are welcomed as treasured guests and soon become “one of the family.” The friendships they form over the course of a Journey are usually just the beginning of lifelong relationships. A trip for an FFCNC member can consist of one or more homestays in addition to travel on their own or as a group in host countries. On their return from a homestay Journey Ambassadors share their experiences with club members who may not have gone on the Journey.
