New Information about the ALEX student program

A few days ago we received an E-mail from Britton Holmes of FFI in Atlanta asking if we were still interested in hosting a student group from the Republic of Moldova in the November of 2022.

Our Board of Directors on May 9th voted in favor of hosting the students as long as Covid conditions permit and the students are all fully vaccinated. Moldova is a small country that borders on the Western part of Ukraine and is likely under threat from Russian attacks.

The Future Leaders Exchange (FLEX) and Youth Exchange and Study (YES) programs are Department of State-funded scholarship opportunities for high school students from 62 countries in Europe, Eurasia, Asia, the Middle East, and Africa. Since the programs had been cancelled due to Covid-19 the ALEX Program, (American Leadership Experience) was developed for a two week program in the United States. One week in Washington, DC, and one week in a local community.

We will keep you informed of developments with this opportunity for our club.
