Helping Hands in the Triad

This edition of the FFCNC Newsletter is about Volunteerism in the Triad, and some details about several future events including two important inbound journeys currently scheduled for October and November of 2022. In 1831, French political scientist Alexis de Tocqueville visited the United States to research and study the American penal system. Over the course of his nine-month tour of America, he was inspired to write about the broader workings of American society, including the uniquely American tendency toward volunteerism.

In his seminal work *Democracy in America*, he notes:

In the United States, as soon as several inhabitants have taken an opinion or an idea they wish to promote in society, they seek each other out and unite together once they have made contact. From that moment, they are no longer isolated but have become a power seen from afar whose activities serve as an example and whose words are heeded.

Our organization is a 501c-3 not for profit entity and as such, in general, we pay no income taxes. Members pay a small amount for annual dues and for the most part their work for Friendship Force is voluntary and without compensation. Many of our members devote a portion of their available time to other worthwhile activities and with that activity they do earn a sense of satisfaction in that they help others in their community.

One of our members, Ralph Cauthen, is currently working on an inbound Journey of students from the Republic of Moldova. Part of the program will be to have the students learn about volunteerism and leadership in America and to devote a portion of their time here in America performing a volunteer activity in one of our local communities.

Helmi's (Eleanor's Mother's) Hot Fudge Sauce

Melt $\frac{1}{4}$ cup shaved bittersweet chocolate and $\frac{1}{4}$ cup butter in a saucepan. Be careful, because this burns easily.

Add ³/₄ cup granulated sugar and ¹/₄ cup dark (unsweetened) cocoa.

Stir in ¹/₂ cup heavy cream (or half-and-half) until mixture is smooth.

Bring to boil, stirring constantly. Remove from heat and stir in 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Cool. Store in the refrigerator. Mixture will harden. Reheat before serving
